

# Volunteerism

## Volunteerism, What Does it Mean to Non-Profit Organizations ?

**Volunteerism** is defined by Merriam-Webster as “the act or practice of doing volunteer work in community service” and **volunteer** is defined by Merriam-Webster as:

**1** : a person who voluntarily undertakes or expresses a willingness to undertake a service: such as

**A** : one who enters into **military** or public service voluntarily

**B (1)** : one who renders a service or takes part in a transaction while having no legal concern or interest

**(2)** : one who receives a conveyance or transfer of property without giving valuable consideration

Volunteering and volunteerism are at the center of success for many non-profit organizations and the continuation to serve those who need help and support in life.

A *military volunteer* (or *war volunteer*) is a person who enlists in military service by free will, and is not a conscript, mercenary, or a foreign legionnaire. Volunteers sometimes enlist to fight in the armed forces of a foreign country, for example during the Spanish Civil War. Military volunteers are essential for the operation of volunteer militaries. Many armies, including the U.S. Army, formerly distinguished between “*Important Volunteers*” enlisted during a war, and “*Regulars*” who serve on long-term basis.

In the United States, troops raised as state militia were always described as “*volunteers*”, even when recruited by conscription. Both U.S. volunteers and regulars were referred to as “U.S.” troops.

Before our country was formed, volunteer militias won independence for the United States and become the country we are today. The U.S. military ended inscription (“*the draft*”) on **January 27, 1973** and since then, all branches of the military are voluntary.

We all know that **The Pharoahs** were established after World War II and organized by returning military veterans. Since then **The Pharoahs** carry military rank for all of our officers so it is natural for **The Pharoahs** to seek out a non-profit organization whose mission is focused on veterans in need of assistance.

**K9s for Warriors** fits the model of a non-profit organization that **The Pharoahs’** initial team of officers, and membership, embraced as its primary recipient of financial support. As their *Mission Statement* indicates, ending veteran suicide suffering from PTSD and combat injuries, and uniting them with dogs who are rescues is a double benefit and an admirable set of goals.



## The Ultimate Guide for Car Show Preparation



Preparing your [vehicle for a car show](#) is a meticulous process that requires careful attention to detail and strategic planning. Each step plays a crucial role in presenting your prized vehicle in its best light, from polishing every inch of paint to ensuring mechanical perfection under the hood.

Whether you're a seasoned car show veteran or a first-time participant, this comprehensive guide is your go-to resource for navigating the intricacies of car show preparation. ### Vehicle Inspection

Before preparing for the car show, it's crucial to begin with a comprehensive vehicle inspection. This involves carefully assessing every aspect of your vehicle's condition, paying close attention to cleanliness, paint quality, and the presence of any visible defects. Start by examining the exterior surfaces for dirt, grime, or scratches that may detract from the overall appearance. Check the paintwork for swirl marks, oxidation, or imperfections that require attention.

Additionally, inspect the vehicle's interior, ensuring it is clean, organized, and free from debris. Imagine you are checking your vehicle as if you were a judge at the event. Walking around your car, you notice a few areas where the paint seems dull, likely due to oxidation from exposure to the elements. Upon closer inspection, you also spot minor scratches on the driver's side door that could benefit from polishing.

### **Interior Detailing**

Interior detailing involves more than just a quick vacuum and wipe down; it's about restoring the cleanliness and shine of every surface within your vehicle's cabin. Start by thoroughly vacuuming the carpets, floor mats, and upholstery to remove any dirt, crumbs, or debris.

Use a gentle cleaner to wipe down the dashboard, door panels, and center console, removing any dust, fingerprints, or stains. Pay special attention to frequently touched areas, such as the steering wheel and gear shifter. After cleaning, apply a protectant to vinyl and plastic surfaces to restore their luster and provide UV protection.

Clean the windows inside and out for a streak-free finish that enhances visibility. For example, you might notice some stains on the seats from spilled coffee, which you tackle with a specialized upholstery cleaner. After thoroughly cleaning and conditioning, the seats look as good as new, enhancing the overall appearance of your car's interior.

### **Exterior Detailing**

Exterior detailing involves a comprehensive process to restore and protect the outer surfaces of your vehicle. Begin by washing the car thoroughly to remove dirt, grime, and accumulated contaminants on the paintwork. Next, use a clay bar or detailing clay to decontaminate the surface by eliminating embedded pollutants like tar, sap, and industrial fallout. After decontamination, polish the paint to remove swirl marks, scratches, and other imperfections, restoring a smooth and glossy finish.

Apply a high-quality wax or paint sealant to protect the paint from UV rays, oxidation, and environmental damage. Remember to [clean the wheels and tires](#), removing brake dust, road grime, and old tire dressing for a clean and glossy appearance. For instance, you may notice some water spots on the paintwork, which you address with a water spot remover before proceeding with the polishing and waxing process. After completing the exterior detailing, your car shines like new, turning heads wherever you go.

### **Engine Bay Cleaning**

Engine bay cleaning involves meticulously removing dirt, grease, and grime from the engine compartment to enhance its appearance and functionality. Cover sensitive components like the alternator, distributor, and electrical connections with plastic bags or aluminum foil to prevent water damage. Then, use a degreaser or engine cleaner to loosen and remove built-up dirt and oil from the surfaces. Agitate stubborn areas with a soft-bristled brush or detailing swabs, ensuring thorough cleaning.

Rinse the engine bay with a gentle stream of water, avoiding direct spraying on sensitive components. After rinsing, dry the engine bay with a clean microfiber towel to prevent water spots and streaks. Finally, apply a water-based dressing or engine bay detailer to rejuvenate plastic and rubber components, leaving them glossy and protected. For example, you might encounter oil stains on the engine cover, which require extra attention and a degreaser to remove them effectively.

### **Paint Correction**

Paint correction involves carefully addressing imperfections like swirl marks, scratches, and dullness in the paint to restore its shine. Start by washing and drying the vehicle thoroughly to remove any dirt. Then, examine the paint for flaws under good lighting. Based on what you find, choose a suitable polishing compound and pad.

Apply the polish to the affected areas with a polisher, working on small sections. Use gentle pressure and keep checking your progress. Once you're satisfied, wipe off any residue with a clean cloth. For instance, if you notice swirl marks on the hood from improper washing, you'll want to correct them to make the surface smooth and shiny again. After paint correction, your car will look much better.

### **Protection Application**

Following the correction phase, the application of paint protection plays a pivotal role in preserving the restored shine and guarding against future damage. This step involves the careful application of a paint sealant or wax, using a clean applicator pad or cloth to create a thin, uniform layer over the paint. Once dry, the haze is buffed off with a microfiber towel, revealing a protected, glossy surface.

At the forefront of paint protection solutions are [paint protection films](#) and [ceramic coating services](#). Paint protection film acts as a durable barrier against environmental aggressors, such as UV rays, road grime, and minor abrasions, effectively preserving the paint's integrity and appearance. Similarly, ceramic coating services offer an advanced level of protection, creating a hard, hydrophobic surface that repels water and contaminants, making maintenance easier and extending the life of the paintwork.

For vehicle owners aiming to showcase their cars at outdoor events or simply maintain their vehicle's aesthetic appeal, investing in a premier paint protection service that includes these advanced protective measures is invaluable. Not only does it ensure the car remains visually appealing, but it also provides long-term protection against the elements, making it a wise choice for preserving your vehicle's beauty and value.

These final touches help enhance your vehicle's visual appeal and ensure that it stands out on display.

### **Logistics Planning**

Logistics planning involves organizing transportation to the car show venue, ensuring you have arrangements for loading and unloading your vehicle and any necessary accommodations. For example, if the car show venue is far from your home, you'll need to plan for transportation, whether driving your vehicle or arranging for shipping. Additionally, consider the logistics of loading and unloading your vehicle at the venue, ensuring you have the necessary equipment and assistance. Finally, if you're staying overnight for the car show, you must arrange accommodations in advance to ensure a smooth experience.

### **Final Inspection**

Final inspection involves carefully examining your vehicle to ensure it meets your standards and is ready for the car show. For example, you'll want to check for any overlooked spots during detailing, ensure that all surfaces are clean and polished, and confirm that any necessary repairs or corrections have been completed. Also, double-check that all [accessories](#) or enhancements are correctly functioning. Conducting a final inspection allows you to address any last-minute issues and ensure your vehicle looks its best when showcased at the car show.



